KDT Update July 2014



With two action packed Kimberley trips completed for 2014 we are now preparing for our final three weeks in the Kimberley in August.

Overview of the June 2014 Trip

The June trip was highly productive and included clinics in the towns of Halls Creek, Fitzroy and Broome. We also visited and provided dental services at Ringer Soak, Muludja, Bayulu, Beidon and Mowanjum communities.

June 2014 Teams

Week 1: We were based in Halls Creek for the week with a team at the Halls Creek hospital and another at the school. Once again our Oral Health Officer Robyn Long played a vital role in supporting the team, communicating with parents and facilitating treatment for the children. Teams also visited the Frail Aged Centre and the DCP hostel and a small team went out to Ringer Soak for 1 ½ days where 27 children were screened and 29 people were treated at the clinic

Week 2: The incoming team from Kununurra worked in Halls Creek for 1 ½ days before heading to Fitzroy Crossing where we stayed for 3 nights. Week 3: For the first time KDT had a team based out of Broome. In Broome we worked at the Broome Aboriginal Medical Service (BRAMS) on Monday then travelled to Mowanjum community near Derby visiting the small community of Bedunburra on the way. Oral Health Promotion and Prevention

Oral health education is an integral part of KDT's services and has played a key role in a significant trend from high initial rates of emergency treatment to now more preventative and restorative treatments in the Kimberley towns and communities we visit. We have had repeated requests for our health promotion booklet *"Strong teeth, strong body, strong mind"* and have now printed and distributed 40,000 copies. Demand also continues to grow for the toothbrushes and toothpaste provided by KDT to Kimberley schools, families and communities. A special thank you to Rotary for assisting KDT by collecting toothpaste and to Rotaract for packing toothbrushes.

KDT Southern

Following our very productive visits earlier in the year to UnitingCare West's Tranby Homelessness Service and Tuart Place in Fremantle, there has been a short lull in the work of KDT Southern during the winter months as our equipment is now based in the Kimberley. These visits will recommence in spring and we are currently purchasing and collecting stock and equipment dedicated to KDT Southern.

Statistics

In June KDT provided oral health education and dental services for 340 people, with a total of 1576 ADA itemised services. These included 316 examinations, 101 extractions, 202 restorations, 69 scale and cleans, 42 radiographs, 40 fluoride/remineralising treatments and 298 fissure seals. In all, this represents approximately \$102,444 worth of dental care, assistance and advice.
